

Call for Submissions – APA 2020

Ready to present your exciting and interesting work in the area of psychology and the law? Submit programming for the 128th Annual Convention of the American Psychological Association to be held Aug 6 – 9, 2020 in Washington, DC!

The American Psychology – Law Society (APA Division 41) invites presentations from any area that involves the intersection of psychology and the law (e.g., practice, teaching, research, policy, law, community outreach).

Important change for APA 2020: The Board of Convention Affairs has eliminated individual paper sessions in light of the low attendance and lack of general interest in them among Convention attendees. Therefore, beginning with the 2020 Convention, APA will allow two options for presenting individual research: poster sessions and data blitzes. A data blitz is a brief (five minute) alternative to the past individual paper presentation format. In light of the format change, we will accept proposals in the following formats: **symposia, skill-building sessions, discussions, data blitzes, and posters**. We strongly encourage individual groups, across and/or within institutions, to submit collaborative symposia. Please note that dual submissions are not being accepted at this time. A dual submission is one in which the same research is presented at more than one conference. You cannot submit a proposal that has already been submitted to another conference.

You are welcome to submit up to two proposals to this conference.
